WebAssign: You will need to create your WebAssign account at <http://www.webassign.net> in order to submit your online homework. You will “self enroll” into this section of MAT 295 by using the following class key: **syr 1659 0557**. You should set up your account using your SU username. Please do this as soon as possible! The first assignment in WebAssign is due at 11PM on August 26!

WebAssign access for the first two weeks of the course is free. After that, you will need to enter an “access code” to continue using WebAssign. See the departmental syllabus for more information.

Written Homework: In addition to the online homework in WebAssign, written homework will be assigned regularly. You are expected to hand in homework assignments on time. Late homework will **not** be accepted.

Quizzes: Quizzes will be given every week in recitation (with the exception of exam weeks). No make up quizzes will be given, but the lowest two quiz scores will be dropped at the end of the semester.

Exams: There will be three midterm exams for the course, given on the following dates:

- Exam 3: November 14.

The material covered on each exam will be announced in class. No make-up exams will be given. If you miss an exam and have an acceptable written excuse, your missed exam score will be replaced by your score on that portion of the material on the final exam.
