Written problems will not be collected. Some variations from the list of homework exercises may be announced in class or online. It is essential to do all the homework assignments in a timely fashion.

Quizzes: From the second week on, there will be a quiz in recitation every week except for the weeks following an exam. The specific sections covered by each quiz will be announced in lecture. The lowest quiz score will be dropped. Quizzes are worth 12% of your grade.

Make-up Policy: A missed quiz or exam will count as a zero unless it is due to a documented religious observance, University-sponsored team event, or documented emergency. For religious observances and University-sponsored events, this documentation must be submitted in advance, and you must make arrangement to take the quiz or exam before the class does.
