**WebAssign Homework:** WebAssign Homework assignments are available online via <a href="www.webassign.net">www.webassign.net</a>.  Note: If written homework is collected and graded, your total homework grade for that material section will be based on both WebAssign Homework and Written Homework. If you do not turn in Written Homework for grading, your grade for that portion of assignment will be zero. Late homework will NOT be accepted.

**Quizzes**: Quizzes will be short and administered during recitation. The quiz questions will be similar to homework problems and lecture examples. Each quiz will cover the sections covered in lecture since the last quiz. Quiz topics and reminders will be announced on Blackboard. There are no make-up quizzes. However, to account for emergency situations up to TWO quizzes may be missed. If you take all of the quizzes, your lowest TWO quiz grades will be dropped. Note that quizzes will be administered during recitation each week with the exception of exam weeks. During the week in which you have an exam, no quiz will be administered during recitation.

**Exams**: Exams will be administered in class. Be sure to bring at least two black or blue pens to each exam. You will not be allowed to use red or pink pen or pencil. Use of calculators or any electronic device is not permitted on exams (or quizzes). Please check the lecture schedule and plan to be in class on the exam day. There will be no make-up exams (for any reason). If you have a documented, extenuating circumstance, please refer to the policy on the Extended/Course-wide syllabus. You will need to contact your instructor and the Dean's Office. In the case of an extenuating circumstance, the 0 will be replaced with the score you earn on the corresponding subsection of the final exam.

**Recitation**: During recitation in addition to taking quizzes, time will be spent discussing questions about the homework. It is in your best interest to not only finish each assignment, but to understand the course concepts and how to apply them to solving the homework problems.

Attendance Policy: It is your responsibility to attend all classes and complete all activities and assignments.

**Grading Note**: Your course grade will be based on three midterm exams (each 20%), Quizzes & Homework (15%) and Final exam (25%).
