

MAT 812, Topics in Complex Analysis

Fall Semester 2018

Course Description: We will introduce Hormander's L^2 estimates of $\bar{\partial}$ equation on the bounded pseudoconvex domain in \mathbb{C}^n as well as many analytic and geometric applications and recent developments. We will try to make the course self-contained by explaining all the details. In this sense, some backgrounds of complex analysis are enough. It helps but is not necessary to know real analysis and some differential geometry, functional analysis, partial differential equations. L^2 method is extremely powerful in the applications of complex and algebraic geometry, but we restrict ourselves to the bounded domains in \mathbb{C}^n for this course.
